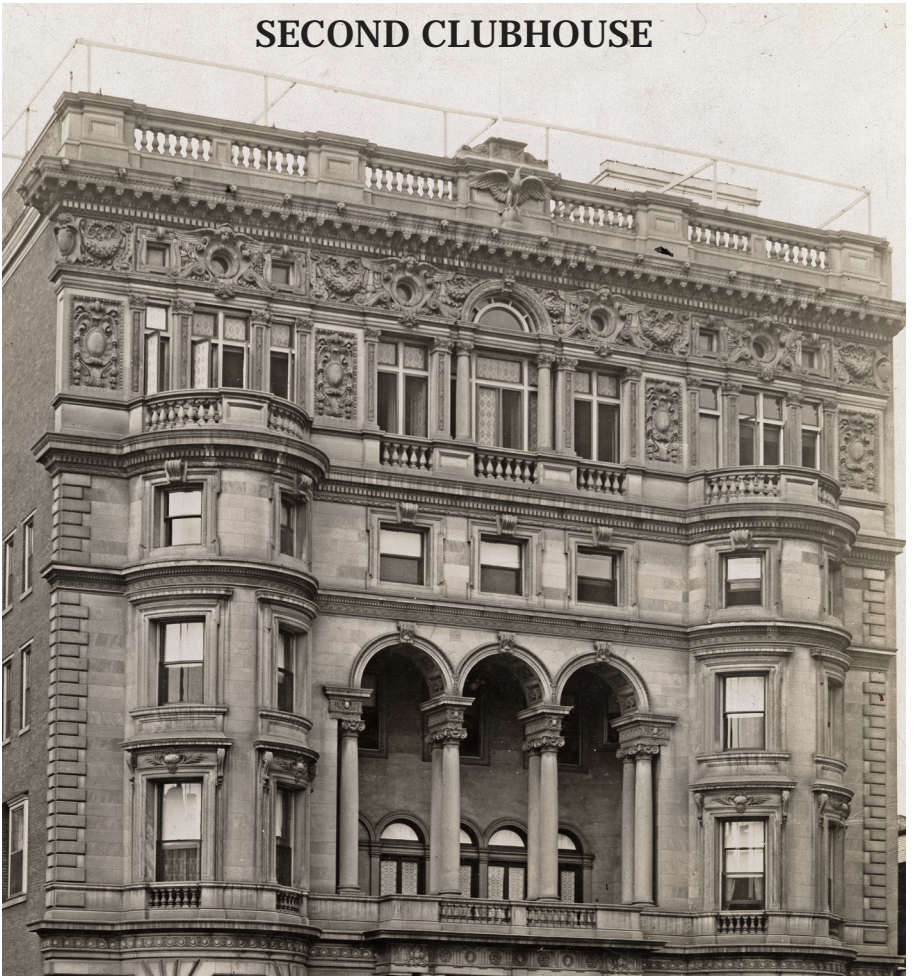


FIRST CLUBHOUSE

The Harrison Marching Society, organized to promote the candidacy of Benjamin Harrison for the presidency, was announced on August 17, 1888. Articles of association of the Columbia Club were filed on February 13, 1889. The first home, the Morrison House on the Circle, was purchased on June 28, 1889.

On a special train, the Club attended the Republican convention in Minneapolis, in which President Harrison was renominated on June 10, 1892. An elaborate welcome was tendered to Benjamin Harrison, who returned to his home in Indianapolis on March 6, 1893, at the conclusion of his term as President. The cornerstone of the new building was laid on June 17, 1899.

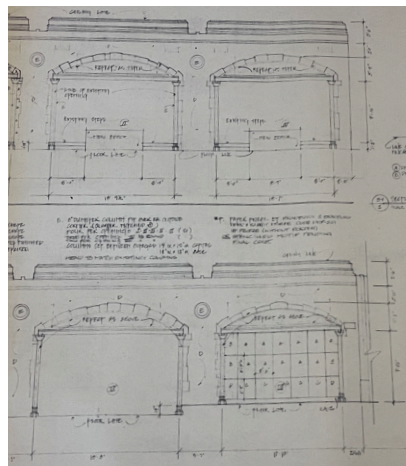
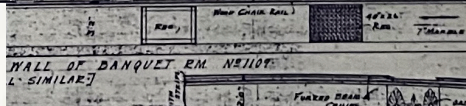
SECOND CLUBHOUSE



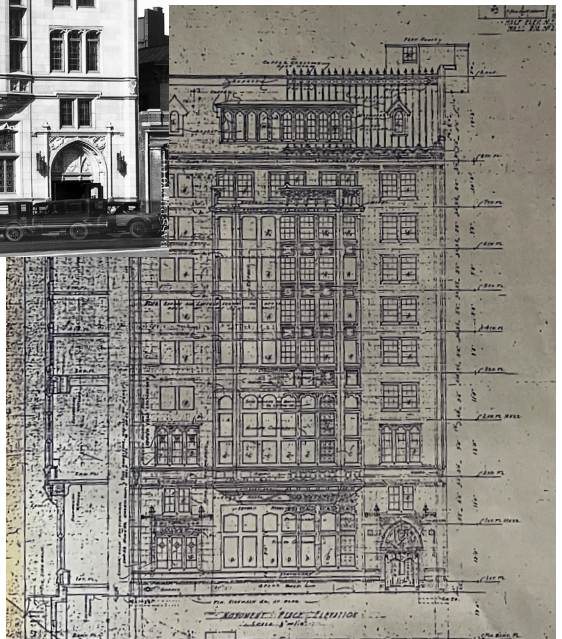
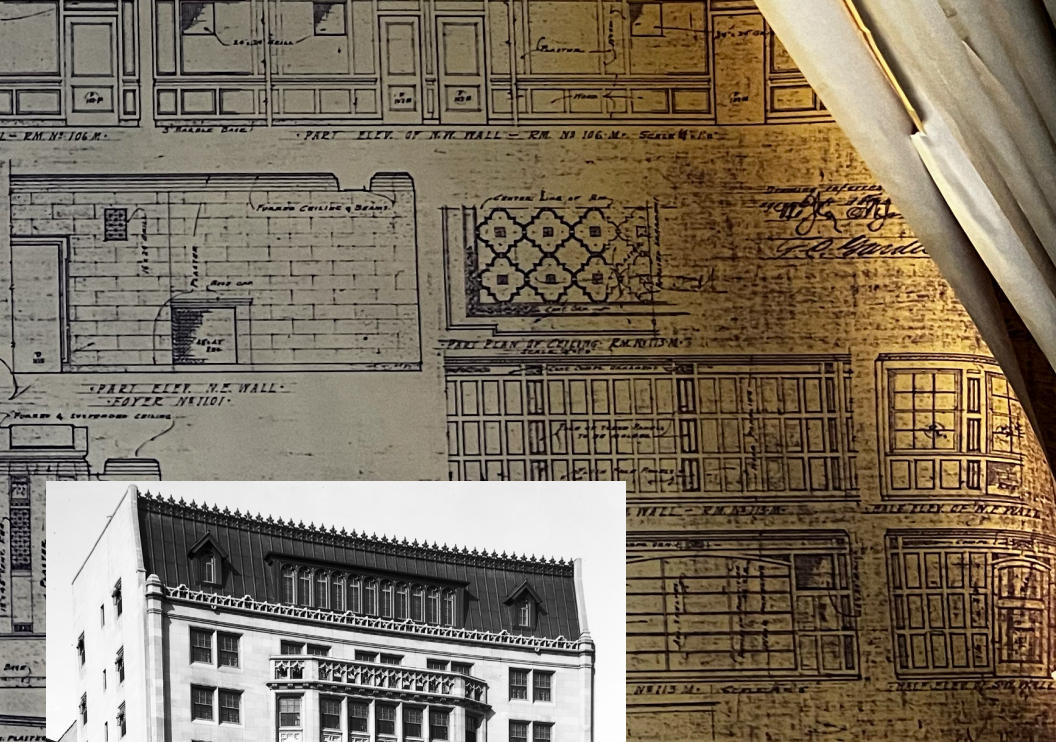
The second home, costing \$192,109.62, was formally dedicated on December 31, 1900. President Theodore Roosevelt entertained at the Club on May 30, 1907, and October 13, 1910.

President William Howard Taft entertained at the Club on July 4, 1911. Columbia Club became the most prominent Republican Club in the Midwest in 1916.

The third clubhouse was chartered in 1924 and was formally dedicated on October 17, 1925.
